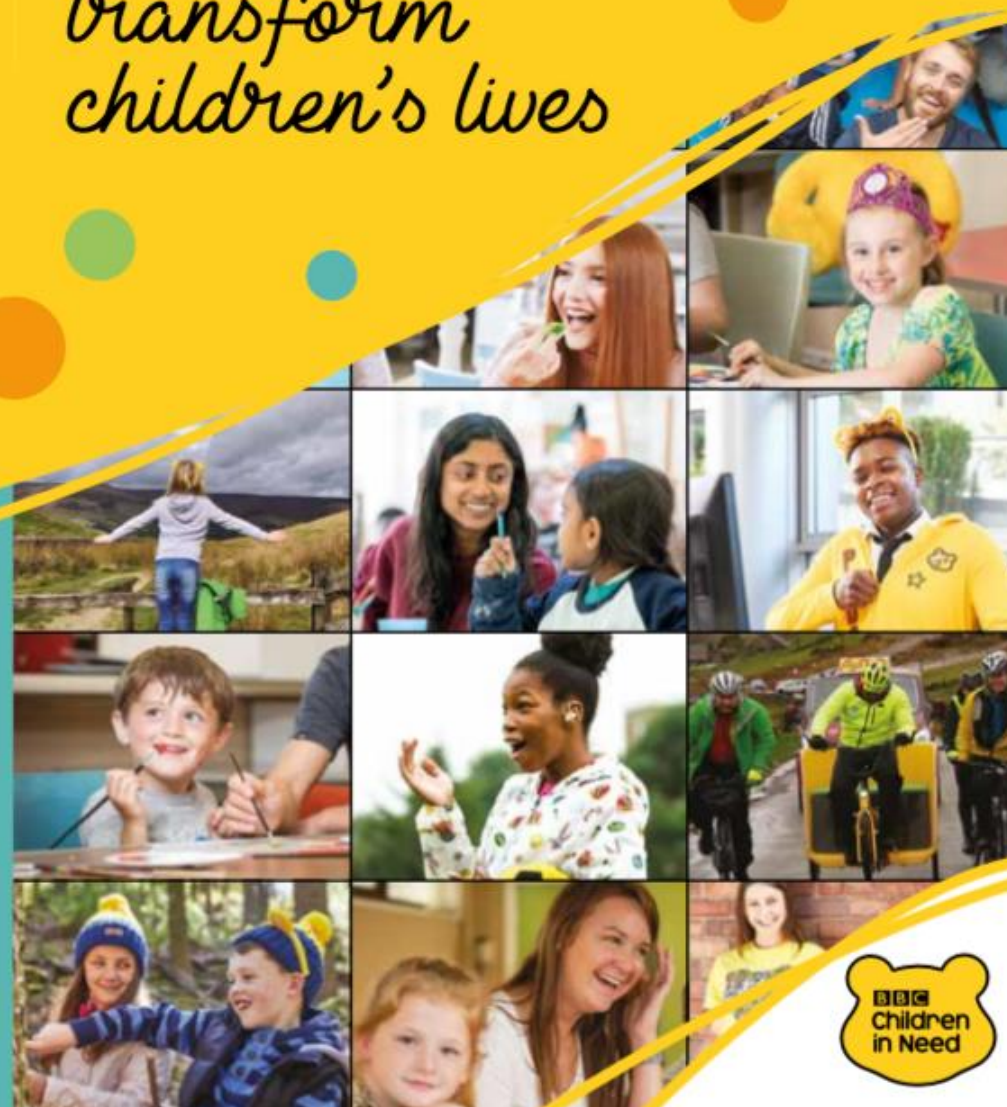

Emergency Essentials

When eight-year-old Alfie's dad had to shield in lockdown due to underlying health conditions, the unexpected financial strain meant the family had to rely on food banks for healthy meals. It was a very difficult time, especially for Alfie who often worries about his parent's health. Soon Alfie's dad could return to work, but he had to clean his work uniform every day on a hot wash, and unfortunately the family couldn't access a washing machine. Thankfully Emergency Essentials were there to help, providing a washing machine through their support for families in crisis. Now, Alfie's dad is back at work, and Alfie has less to worry about in this incredibly difficult time.

Oasis Youth Centre

When Clara found out that her mum had depression she struggled to understand what it meant, and how it made her feel. But thanks to activity sessions run by Oasis Youth Centre, she was able to learn more about mental health and talk openly about her feelings. Now aged 17, Clara is still supported by the incredibly important work at Oasis, and during lockdown this support has only been more crucial. Through online cookery, meditation and wellbeing sessions Oasis has helped Clara through the uncertainty of the pandemic, and as the situation evolves, they will continue to support young people through the challenges it brings.

Jonny (14) and Holly (10)* weren't able to attend a family funeral and were very upset. Their dad spoke to Nelson's Journey who suggested that the family used their Smiles & Tears smartphone app with the children. On the day and time of the funeral, Jonny and Holly used the app to virtually release balloons in memory of their Uncle. The impact of Covid-19 has meant that many grieving families and friends have been unable to meet together. The app has helped children and young people supported by Nelson's Journey to save their memories and feelings towards their special person.
