Gods and Mortals

English:

Pupils will focus on:

- Using a range of books to find out information about Zeus and other Greek gods and goddesses, using different strategies to record information as they do so;
- Drafting, editing then typing up a description of their favourite Greek god or goddess;
- Tell the story of the war between Sparta and Athens;
- Reading about the legend of Icarus and Daedalus;
- Drafting a diary entry;

- Incorporating hypothetical questions from the viewpoint of Icarus and Daedalus into their diary entry;
- Proofing and writing the final version of the diary entry;
- Reciting the Greek alphabet;
- Discussing different versions of the Trojan Horse;
- Debating letting the horse inside the city gates;
- Instruction writing on how to rescue Helen of Troy;
- Reading about Theseus and the Minotaur;
- Drafting, writing and refining a letter to plead for clemency from the Minotaur;
- Pandora's Box writing a character description for a Greek God or Goddess.

Maths:

We will be concentrating on place value and addition and subtraction this term.

Science:

This term we will be focusing on Plants and Animals and Humans.
