Curriculum Intent

Our English curriculum is comprehensive and enriching for all students, and inspires a love of reading and writing. We ensure that the curriculum is relevant to all learners and allows for an exploration of wider social issues. We encourage students to explore a variety of texts in order to discover new ideas and make connections both within literature and to the wider world. We build on skills of analysis, interpretation and communication throughout the key stages to develop our student's excitement around the subject but also skills to help them access a full range of next steps. We also expose them to a wide variety and breadth of texts, both full-length and extracts, introducing diverse ideas and voices from outside of their everyday experiences, while also exploring topical and relevant issues that affect our particular learners. During their time in English, all students see two theatre performances. This immerses students into the historical significance of the theatre, as well as provides access to cultural experiences they may not otherwise have. All students have the opportunity to participate in ongoing national writing competitions, and have their written work published. Our students leave us having become creative and enthusiastic linguists and writers, who are confidently and articulately able to express their own ideas both in writing and verbally. They also become critical and empathetic audiences, not just of literature but of the world around them.
