Encouraging Reading for Pleasure: Our school library catalogue online and introducing 'Scholastic'

Dear Parent/Carer,

Our school is strongly committed to improving literacy and knows the importance of reading for pleasure. There is good evidence to suggest that young people who read for pleasure daily perform better in reading tests than those who never do. We want to encourage children to enjoy reading and to read a wide range of good quality literature.

I am delighted to inform you that the school has recently made a significant investment in our library with the introduction of a new online version of our library catalogue as well as an interactive reading programme. The new system(s) allows pupils, staff and parents to view our school library catalogue online and pupils are encouraged to use this to search for new books, quiz on books they have read and take termly reading tests to generate a Lexile and track their development. A Lexile measure reflects a student's reading ability – a chart has been attached to make it simpler.

The Scholastic system includes a fantastic new 'Recommended' feature which recommends new books and authors based on the books that your child has already read. You will be able to use this feature at home to help your child select their next book. Scholastic can be accessed at home at: https://slz03.scholasticlearningzone.com/slz-portal/#/login3/GBR8TF8

The new library now has hundreds of books for your child to choose from. We have invested thousands of pounds into the library as we firmly believe reading is the key to learning. The library is arranged by genre and books are colour-coordinated to correspond to Lexile levels (linked to Scholastic). Pupils will be reading once a week in form time and will attend the library once a week in their English lessons. The library will provide them with the opportunity to change their books, read for pleasure at breaks, use laptops to quiz on what they have read and use our bespoke work stations for group or individual work.

A security system is now in place in the library whereby all books are micro-chipped. Pupils can loan books for 14 days and a planner must be present. The librarian will stamp their planner with a due date – please ensure pupils return books on time. If a student loses or damages the book, they will be asked to cover the costs for a replacement. If they need to renew their book or request a reservation, they may do so with the librarian. Returned books must be given directly to the librarian due to the security system in place.

Having the library accessible in this way and having parents engaged with reading will help support our commitment to improving literacy standards. Pupils should be reading for a minimum for **20 minutes per day**, which could positively improve attainment across the school.

We hope you find the new facility useful and welcome any feedback.
