Example: 1. You can **infer** the meaning of the word from the context of the rest of the sentence.

- 2. From this we may **infer** that photosynthesis has taken place.
- 3. It could be **inferred** that the speaker in the poem was depressed.
- 4. This is **inferred** because earth has a gravitational pull.
- 5. I don't like what your **inferring** about my behaviour.
- 6. Are you inferring I'm guilty?
- 7. Specifically show me the available information for that **inferential** judgement.
- 8. There is **inferential** evidence that shows a rich vocabulary aids future success amongst young people.
